

BIRTH (2003-2004)

In the summer of 2003, a small group of men and women came together in Lexington, SC, and Columbia, SC, to plant a church. That year, RADIUS Church and Oasis Church began as two separate bodies. But by the fall of 2004, the two churches merged and began meeting in Midway Elementary School as RADIUS Church.



HUSTLE (2004-2007)

The years 2004-2007 represented a time of foundational growth for RADIUS Church. After merging, RADIUS Church became known for its "crazy" generosity. We didn't have a whole lot of resources then, but we tried to serve creatively with what we had. Movies in the Park, handing out thousands of free newspapers or mountain dews or roses for Valentine's Day... these were the kind of things that developed the foundation of RADIUS Church. As leadership changes came into play, several younger men bore greater weight in the church. This time is described as "whiplash" for members and leaders alike at RADIUS - who were functioning at an incredibly fast pace without much infrastructure.



INNOVATE (2007-2009)

The Lord provided RADIUS Church with a new leader - Todd Carnes became lead pastor in 2008. RADIUS became more innovative and organized in its pursit of radical generosity as it served the community and rolled out Vision 2012 to give away \$1 million, have 100 small groups, and plant 1 church.

In January of 2021, our partners were given a book called My RADIUS: The Story of RADIUS Church which tells the story of the first 18 years of RADIUS Church. The book is comprised of six stages. Within those six stages were many stories that each played a part in forming who we are as a church today.

Throughout the last 18 years, God has uniquely shaped us as RADIUS Church. We remember and praise God for the stories we can tell of the gospel spreading throughout The Midlands. We are thankful for God's faithfulness through an imperfect, weak, and sometimes crazy group of people.

Then, imagine - what if the first 18 years were only the introduction? What if God is putting pen to paper NOW to write the first chapter? WHAT IF SIGNIFICANT ADVENTURES that we couldn't ever imagine are still yet to be experienced?

Keep reading as we unfold a three year plan that will require all of us to team up as we continue the story. You are invited into a vision that is not about building bigger; it's about activating "U"... to double disciples, double groups, double churches, and double generosity. This isn't just a defining moment for RADIUS Church, it's a defining moment for U! And it starts right where you are...in your radius. Jump into the story and let's go!



ORGANIZE (2010-2011)

After supporting several other ministries, RADIUS Church was finally able to buy, renovate, and move into their own building from October 2010 - April 2011. As they moved into the building, RADIUS improved its Kids ministries, served its new radius and doubled in size.

RADIUS Lexington moved to 300 West Main Street.





ESTABLISH (2011-2015)

RADIUS established its name and its beliefs as it embarked on a slew of creative internal and outreach ministries while creating several intriguing sermon series to combat the culture of the day and grow in relationship with the churches of Lexington. Meanwhile, RADIUS focused its efforts on planting RADIUS White Knoll and creating missions opportunities around the globe.

MULTIPLY (2016-NOW)

Todd Carnes stepped out of his role leading RADIUS as John Reeves stepped back in to lead and to focus on training and sending others to plant churches. Since then, RADIUS has planted churches in Saluda, Centerville, Irmo, and Columbia. Even during the COVID pandemic, RADIUS Southside was planted.

Our Plumblines


Our plumblines are themes that have developed and continued to sink deep into our DNA over the last 18 years:

A Healthy V.

Before you multiply and make a disciple, let's make sure what you are multiplying is healthy. This doesn't mean perfect - we won't ever be that. But it does mean that we are living in a relationship with God that produces and supports the thoughts, feelings, choices, and habits that lead us to do what is right as a result of who we have become. In other words, the Holy Spirit is at work in our lives, which overflows to those in our radius.

This has to be a personal decision you have to make - asking God to continually show you what screws need to be tightened, what beams need to be ripped out and replaced, what hinges need to be greased as we build a life that glorifies Him and leads others to Him.

- **IMAGINE** An imperfect but healthy U growing spiritually, seeking help as needed, and others being changed by the overflow of the Holy Spirit at work in you.
- **PRAY** That God will help you recognize areas of struggle and ask Him to help you overcome them. Ask Him to put people in your life to help you, too.
- MULTIPLY Surround yourself with someone who will tell you the truth and give them
 permission to do so. This is part of being discipled. Ask for help from someone close
 to you, your group leader or your pastor, if something in your life feels out of control
 and unfixable.

What Does UX2 Mean?

No one in this world has the same radius as you. God has placed you where you live, work, and play for a reason, and no other person can love people and serve in the ways God has called you to do. Maybe it's how you treat the person working the drive-thru or the cashier at the local grocery store. Maybe it's how you spend your money or what you say on social media. As the gospel shapes you, those in your radius are taking note and the opportunity to multiply disciples begins.

A DISCIPLE...

someone who follows the teachings, life, and aim of another until the person becomes like the master. Therefore, a disciple is someone becoming more and more like Christ.

DISCIPLESHIP...

the activity of forming intentional friendships with others, to walk through life together, and to teach them to become like Christ.



HOW DO I MAKE A DISCIPLE?

Making disciples is never easy.
This chart is never as linear as it appears. Even so, we hope you can use this as a resource for discovering how you can begin to make disciples in your radius.

ALWAYS PRAY

Prayer is critical as we make disciples. Pray for intimacy with Jesus. Pray that you will continue to look more and more like Jesus and that you can help others to that end as well.

A HEALTHY YOU

If you haven't been discipled yet, then you won't be able to multiply. The first step is always to find someone who can disciple you.

LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR

As you grow in discipleship, it should be evident in your life, and your neighbors should be able to see the change.

SHARE YOUR STORY

When your neighbor observes the change in you, they're likely to desire it for themself. This is when you have the opportunity to share with your neighbor why you live the way you do.

STORIES, SCRIPTURES, PRAYER

Share with each other what Jesus is doing in your life. Share what you're learning about as you read the Bible. Pray together – the truth about yourself and the truth about God.

SEND THEM

The whole point of discipleship is to reach all the world with the Good News of Jesus Christ. That means we must always be ready to send our disciples.

Grow Within a Group?

Life transformation begins with lesus and a personal relationship with Him. Being a healthy U is growing within a group. We believe that life change best occurs in biblical community which is why we desire every man, woman, student, and kid to be involved in a group.

RADIUS Groups are small, casual gatherings meeting in homes, restaurants, and at our campuses. As our church body grows, we want "small" to become descriptive of our groups to ensure a safe community and conscientious care. In order to stay small, we want to develop a mindset of multiplication within our groups. The next leader, or apprentice, should be ready to rise up within each group to form and lead another group. As our RADIUS kids and RADIUS students dive into their grade level small groups, they'll find leaders who show up consistently, foster fun and relationships, all while drawing them closer to Jesus.



Successful groups launch new leaders and multiply. The key to this lies in identifying and equipping your "Next Leader." This is the group member who can, with preparation, practice and prayer, step into leading their own group.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN AN APPRENTICE **OR YOUR NEXT LEADER:**

- Character Obvious spiritual growth and a desire to make disciples.
- Coachability Acknowledges room for growth and instruction as a group leader.
- Competency Has a 'knack' for building community.

WHAT OUR CHURCH MISSES WHEN GROUPS **FAIL TO MULTIPLY:**

- Enough groups to welcome newcomers into the RADIUS family.
- Places to allow potential group leaders to exercise their gifts and grow spiritually.
- Leaders who can rest from leading because there are others in the wings ready to jump in.

What does it mean to multiply a group?

If your group has regularly shared stories, opened the scriptures and prayed together, you've created a bond that can be a little painful to break. Multiplying means that the Next Leader will take a few people from the current group and "seed" a new group. Healthy things grow. Healthy things reproduce. Your healthy group can weather the discomfort of parting with people you've grown to know and love, in order to create room for more people to find Biblical community at RADIUS.

We began attending RADIUS Church right before COVID hit the world. As soon as we could, we joined a group and immediately fell in love with our new friends. When the group leader began talking about the need to multiply new groups out of our current group, we didn't want to lose the new friends and community we had found. However, we wanted others to have what we have. We also love our radius of Batesburg-Leesville and thought it would be great to give those that live right in our backyard a group to join. This fall, we will multiply a group into Batesburg-Leesville and offer biblical community there.

GOD'S MOVEMENT NEVER PAUSES

RADIUS Centerville began in 2018 when a group of people, passionate about their radius of western Lexington County decided to move from their church home - RADIUS Lexington - into Rocky Creek Elementary to plant a new church. During COVID, schools didn't allow outside groups to use their facilities so RADIUS Rocky Creek moved to the field in front of their new building that was in the process of being renovated. They changed their name to reflect their new community and held church outdoors for 44 weeks - braving a South Carolina summer and a few cold winter Sundays. While many churches were seeing less than 50% of their typical attendance returning to church because of COVID-19, RADIUS Centerville experienced numbers equal to or more than pre-COVID numbers and most were guests who realized a new church was meeting outdoors right in their own backyard. Numbers doubled when moving into their new building in April. In the first five weeks, RADIUS Centerville connected over 40 new families into the church body.

GOD MOVES SOUTHSIDE BAPTIST TO GIVE

Theresa Hodge was walking her dog in her neighborhood one day when she was stopped by Cheryl Reeves, who was working in her yard. It wasn't an unusual thing for Cheryl, who tends to dive into deep conversations at unusual times. Somehow, Cheryl got on the topic of church-planting, explaining that RADIUS Church was actually given a building by a church in Red Bank.

Theresa's eyes widened when she shared that her own church—Southside Baptist Church in Columbia—was in the same spot. For over a hundred years, Southside Baptist Church had existed to worship God and serve their community. Now, they were praying and looking to give their resources and people over to someone who would have the same goals in mind.

Little did they know that for over eighteen years, RADIUS Church has been praying for God to open the door for them to plant a church in Columbia. And that same week, Scott Shuford called John Reeves to tell him he was thinking about planting a church.

Now, Scott Shuford is leading RADIUS Southside in the old Southside Baptist building, and the Lord answered both churches' prayers in the middle of a pandemic.

ur family started attending RADIUS Lexington in fall 2009. After a couple of years, we were asked to lead a small group at our home in the Batesburg/Saluda area. Our group members were made up of unchurched folks from Saluda who began to worship with us on Sunday mornings at RADIUS Lexington. In small group one evening, someone said, "Why are we driving to Lexington? Why can't we have a RADIUS Saluda and serve our radius?" Ben made a phone call to Chris Seeby and the ball began to roll. God was moving in Saluda and it was time.

We began with a very small and dedicated group. As our numbers grew, we developed some great relationships, and God was faithful to bring the right people at the right time. I always wondered why someone we didn't know would come to church in our barn!? God just doesn't move the usual way! It was the hardest work and the biggest blessing to be allowed to host a church plant. It will always be a treasured time for us as a family. Our best memories are the times of breaking up into twos or threes with people of different races and different ages than us and praying for our community!

Why Do We Plant Churches?

- New churches are shown to be the most effective method of reaching those not already part of a church, attracting three to six times more non-Christians than older churches.
- New churches develop leaders at the new church as well as at the sending church. As leaders go to plant, new leaders arise at the sending church to continue current ministry.
- Church planting sparks renewal in existing churches. That renewal can catalyze churches in every neighborhood to innovate and live generously as they strive to meet the needs of their neighbors.
- Increasing the number of believers living out the gospel can have a significant positive effect on life within a community.



fter a decade in financial services, I felt like God was calling Ame to something different. 



Since the birth of RADIUS Church in 2003, God's faithfulness has been evident through your generosity and determination to work together to accomplish our mission. Over the last 18 years, we've been able to generously give almost \$6 million to local and international partnerships, church planting here and abroad, as well to those in our local communities. By 2024, we want to double what we gave in the first 18 years.



RADIUS was birthed with no revenue.

Established first generosity goal of \$1 million over three years beginning in 2009.

Invested over \$5 million in the work of God here and around the world through our core value of generosity.

Purchased 4 buildings and fully renovated all of them (RADIUS Greenville included).

Received 2 buildings as gifts, valued conservatively at \$3 million.

Acquired and renovated the above stated \$10+ million portfolio with only a single capital call in 2011 (\$75,000).

WE SERVE OUR SCHOOLS

Our schools and their staff had to endure many difficult and unexpected changes during COVID. RADIUS Lexington loved the schools in their community well by feeding teachers and challenging their congregation to adopt a school nurse. 202 families adopted a school nurse as a part of the campaign.

They served:

- 14 schools with 7 food trucks
- 1586 teachers and staff
- 52 school nurses

300 FREE PIZZAS

RADIUS White Knoll is known for loving their community. In June 2020, they began brainstorming ideas for promoting racial unity within the White Knoll community. So they made a few calls to pizza places and Marco's Pizza generously offered to allow RADIUS to set up right outside their facility and purchase as many pizzas as they could in three hours

A few hours later, Marco's was almost completely out of supplies. It was awesome.

As the Marco's employees worked diligently inside, RADIUS partners were either in the drizzling rain by the road holding up signs--"FREE FREE FREE FREE PIZZA"--or handing whole boxes of free pizza through car windows or in person. With each pizza they would place atop the box a postcard displaying a beautiful sunset behind a cross with bold letters across the front: "all colors united by the cross."

300 pizzas later, RADIUS White Knoll was able to spread the good news about Jesus, fight for racial unity, and provide supper for a couple hundred folks.

GIVE RELATIONALLY



- 2 Marco's Pizza giveaway to the community.
- Hosted the WKHS football team for breakfast and dinner.

CHURCH PLANTING

Generosity paves the way for new RADIUS Church locations and church plants when we give beyond our radius to those in need. Communities are strengthened through the radical generosity that accompanies a new RADIUS location through funds funneled into the community and by our partners "sent" to serve where they live. Communities impacted in the last three years through a RADIUS Church plant:

- 2018 RADIUS Centerville Reaching Gilbert, Batesburg, Leesville, and West Lexington.
- 2019 RADIUS Irmo Reaching Irmo and Dutch Fork.
- 2020 RADIUS Southside Reaching downtown Columbia.

In 2014, RADIUS Church realized that we had a limited vision into the true needs in our community. We knew that we needed trusted partners that had day-to-day insight into the lives of families within our community. Partners that also wanted to do good and take care of these hidden needs. That's when Give Hope was born.

Give Hope is a partnership between RADIUS Church and school administrators, guidance counselors, and teachers to take care of our community. Funds are quickly and effectively funneled through our schools to take care of crisis needs as they arise – not just at Christmas – but all throughout the year. Over the last three years, we've established partnerships with schools in 7 districts and were able to give to families through 64 schools.

Just this year, we've heard stories of Give Hope funds being used for

- Groceries
 - Hotel rooms for families who found themselves homeless
- Funeral expenses for a student who passed away

 - Makes budgeting and planning easier for our church
 - Lessens the church admin costs
 - It's safe and convenient

4. INTENTIONAL

thoughtful - joyful - invested

- How much house is enough? What kind of cars, toys, vacations, and savings accounts will foster contentment? The answers to these questions are unique to you. What if you placed a cap on spending and saving? What if you decided that every additional dollar above the cap goes toward the kingdom and courageous giving? What could that look like for your family?
- Consider setting a lifetime generosity goal (a specific number) for your family's kingdom giving over the course of your life.

5. COURAGEOUS

eternally focused - motivated expectant

- Find context to share your story to inspire the next generation of courageous givers.
- Compete estate planning that accurately reflects kingdom priorities.







