RADIUS



During Pray May 2023, we all learned to pray using the ACTS prayer model. Use the guide below to continue praying through Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, and Supplication. The weekly prompts on the left will guide you to pray through our sermon series.

Adoration

Adoration is telling God the truth about Himself - worshipping Him and acknowledging His greatness. Beginning prayer this way not only reminds us of who God is and of His power but also aligns our hearts with His.

Confession

As we confess, we tell the truth about ourselves. When we step into the light of God's greatness, we recognize how we fall short. Confession is a great privilege because it allows us to take hold of the forgiveness offered to us by Jesus.

Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving is a humble response to the generosity of God, acknowledging that every good and perfect gift comes from Him. In spite of who we are and what we have done, God has been and continues to be good. Thanksgiving recognizes that all we are and all we have is because of him.

Supplication

Supplication is just the practice of asking. Jesus told us to ask, but he also modeled an asking that was submissive and surrendered. He delights in giving. Asking glorifies him and humbles us. Asking encourages the building of greater faith and draws us closer to our good God, whose faithfulness and love never ends.

Week 1 - Everyone has a radius.

- Spend time praying with the Word of God each day. We want to pray aligned with God's purpose. But we need to know His Word to know God's purpose.
- Monday (Matt. 6:9-13), Tuesday (Luke 1:46-55), Wednesday (Matt. 9:35-38), Thursday (Ps. 51), Friday (Eph. 1:15-23), Saturday (Ps. 27), Sunday (John 17:20-26)
- Pray for the names on your dominoes and those in your radius.

Week 2 - Pray the truth about God.

- Set aside a devoted time and place to pray.
- Start your prayer time telling God the truth about who He is.
- Pray for the names on your dominoes and those in your radius.

Week 3 - Pray the truth about yourself.

- Start your prayer time again this week by telling God the truth about who He is.
- Next, pray the truth about yourself. Confess your sins before God, and ask forgiveness.
- Pray for the names on your dominoes!

Week 4 - Pray with gratitude.

- Start your prayer time again this week by telling God the truth about who He is.
- Next, pray the truth about yourself. Confess your sins before God, and ask forgiveness.
- Pray for the names on your dominoes!
- Thanksgiving recognizes that all we are and all we have is because of him. Make a gratitude list this week as you pray and thank God for those things.
